- Blended mobility of school learners meeting in PERUGIA, ITALIA, C2 - October 2018



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The aim of Erasmus+ project is to raise the awareness on one of the most important problem of student age, 'Cyberbullying'.

During the 2 years (2017-2019) all partners from 5 schools, teachers, parents and students prepared posters and art exhibitions, video presentations, statistical surveys on the topic, workshops, shows and multicultural campaigns against bullying and cyberbullying. Partners involved in the project helped raise awareness about cyberbullying and take preventive action against this ever-growing problem.





The Project Team have started activities:

- Sharing information and recommendations in intercultural campaign to prevent bullying
- Presentations our country, school, national system of education, antibullying practices/ project as resource material to stop school violence
- Experiencing, participating and sharing the interesting and diverse cultures of European partners
- Positive engagement and commitment of partners in TM prevent cyberbullying and promote safe and responsible Internet use throughout their communities by implementing antibullying programme.



The results and changes in the institution were presented on the international level as well. As a result of the international project work, team work has become an integral part of the institutional structure. We've also learnt a lot about cooperation with the parents.
